

Chairmans Report

Councillor Richard Godden thanked his fellow Councillors for their support during the past year, which has been reasonably uneventful. Support has been given to several organisations in the parish in the form of grants, but is suffering as a result as a result of budgetary restraints from Cornwall Council. The winter weather has resulted in even more potholes this year and despite constant reporting to Highways they have been very slow in repair, if at all. He also thanked PCSO Claire Drennan for her constant supports for the Parish and her sterling efforts with the implementation of the radar screening of traffic at St Kew Highway

Devon and Cornwall Police Report – PCSO Drennan

Crime figures for the year were given as 24 crimes of which 10 were detected and 2 ongoing. She reported that retiring police would not be replaced and only one officer to cover the area. She therefore urged all to report whatever they need to, even though it may be an arduous task, and help the police to maintain a safe area to live in.

Cornwall Councillors Reports.

County Councillor Penny gave a breakdown of the structure of Cornwall Council and this years' budget. He said that Community network panels are being asked to take more responsibility something that is not always possible within the confines of parish expenditure. Open questioning followed and improvements to public transport, education and repercussions from the implemented living wage were discussed.
