



EASY SHORTBREAD

Ingredients

125g/4oz butter

55g/2oz caster sugar, plus extra to finish

180g/6oz plain flour

Method

Heat the oven to 190C/375F/Gas 5.

Beat the butter and the sugar together until smooth.

Add the flour and stir until smooth.

Roll out to a thickness of 1cm/½in.

Cut into rounds or fingers and place on a baking tray. Sprinkle with caster sugar and chill in the fridge for 20 minutes.

Bake in the oven for 15-20 minutes, or until golden-brown. Set aside to cool on a wire rack.

GILL'S RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Rogan Josh Pasta

- 250g dried tagliatelle, or fresh if preferred
- 1 onion, chopped finely
- 400g lamb mince
- 2 tablespoons rogan josh curry paste
- 300g passata
- 175g cherry tomatoes halved
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh coriander

Method

Put the tagliatelle into a saucepan and cover with boiling water. Bring to the boil and simmer for 10 - 12 minutes or until al dente.

Meanwhile heat a lidded pan, spray with cooking spray and cook the onion for a few minutes until it begins to soften.

Add the lamb mince and curry paste and cook on high for 1 minute stirring constantly. Stir in the passata and cherry tomatoes, and bring to the boil. Cover and simmer gently for 5 minutes.

Drain the pasta and add to the lamb sauce along with the coriander. Toss to coat the pasta in the sauce and serve and serve immediately.

The lamb mince can be replaced with beef mince or vegetarian mince as required.

The Parish Council meets in the Parish Hall, St Kew Churchtown at 7.30pm on the second Tuesday of each month. Members of the public are welcome to attend and address the meeting on any subject of concern.

St Kew Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 10th January 2015 at 7.30 pm in the Parish Hall.

Present: Chairman Councillor R Godden, Councillors J Lethbridge, T Mott, J Rowe, A Godden and B Finnemore. Cornwall Councillor S Knightly, and four members of the public in attendance.

Apologies received from: B Hawken, S Liddiard, J Rickard and Cornwall Councillor A Penny.

The Chairman reported on a meeting with Oliver Jones head of highways at Cormac on the state of the roads in St Kew. Mr Jones said that budget constraints, lack of funds and the pressure to have potholes repaired within 48 hours (otherwise litigation could result) meant that they were not always repaired to a standard he would like. Doing this left little funds available for other road maintenance and repair work. There were 24 potholes on St Kew on the system to be repaired and would be done in the next two weeks. Mr Jones advised lobbying our local MP for more funds to be made available from the Government.

The council has received a reply from Scott Mann MP on the closure of the surgery at St Kew Highway on Thursdays. The letter is on the council's website: www.stkewparish.org.uk.

Councillor S. Knightly requested that details of the dog barking problem at Lanow to be forwarded to him.

A request from Helston Town Council for support in bringing the Tour of Britain cycle race to Cornwall. The council replied with their support.






This term the children have settled back in well. We are looking at winter, birds, Chinese New Year, Valentines Day and focusing especially on literacy, letter sounds and spelling their names.



Time

Where does time go?

A moment ago it was Christmas and we were trying to resolve a lovely problem - how can you get 150 children, 248 adults, a live donkey, and a baby lamb into a church which seats 180? Well you can, just! And now we are looking at, and preparing for, Lent and Easter.

Lent: a time of.... giving up, abstaining, taking up? We all treat it differently. So here is something to think about - our use of time. Time flies by, and in all the rushing around we can forget what a gift it is. We have been given time, the question is how do we use it? Over the years here are some quotes from wiser people than me:

A man who dares to waste one hour of time has not discovered the value of life. *Charles Darwin, The Life & Letters of Charles Darwin*

Time is what we want most, but what we use worst. *William Penn*

The future starts today, not tomorrow. *Pope John Paul II*

I wasted time, and now doth time waste me. *William Shakespeare, Richard II*

The right time is any time that one is still so lucky as to have. *Henry James*

It's not that we have little time, but more that we waste a good deal of it. *Seneca*

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. *Ecclesiastes*

Do any or all of these strike a bell in your life? I once went on a course during which we were to have a talk on "Time management in General Practice", the speaker turned up 15 minutes late! I never did put into practice anything he said.

So at this time of year instead of just rushing around, take time to reflect and think for a while on time and how we use it. It is a gift, are we thankful for it?

ANNIVERSARY OF THE FIRST WORLD WAR (LEST WE FORGET)

February – March 1917

Peace Negotiations

Various attempts to find some kind of common ground to begin peace negotiations by both the Central Powers (Germany, Austria-Hungary, Turkey) and the Entente Powers (Britain, France, Russia and Italy) failed during January 1917 owing to the incompatibility of war. France demanded the restoration of the Alsace Lorraine regions, which Germany refused to surrender. Russia demanded Constantinople, the Turkish capital, which was naturally highly objectionable to the Turks. Italy and Austria-Hungary also had conflicting requirements.

Home Front

Throughout WW1 Britain imported food by ship. To bring about the surrender of Britain through starvation, the German Navy attempted to destroy all nation's ships using their submarine fleet. By the end of 1916 U-Boats were sinking about 300,000 tons per month. In February 1917, they torpedoed 230 ships and the following month a record 507,000 tons of shipping was lost. Initially, the government encouraged the population to voluntarily ration themselves but this failed. Food prices rose and by October 1916 coal was in short supply and rationed.


Any area that could grow food was converted to allotments and livestock were kept in people's back gardens.

One submarine commander was an Austro-Hungarian Georg Ludwig von Trapp. His later marriage to his children's tutor and their escape from Nazi Germany provided the inspiration for the musical The Sound of Music.


Sinkings of shipping around the Cornish coast mirrored the wider picture.



On 1 February, German U-55 attacked the cargo ship SS Essonite sailing from Caernarfon to Rochester, which was sunk 3 miles NNW of Trevose Head; ten sailors were lost. On the same day, U-55 also scuttled the fishing boat Ada and sank boat Inverlyon. The following day the Russian sailing vessel Pomoschnick was scuttled. On 6 February, 3 miles NNE of Gurnard's Head the U-55 torpedoed SS Saxon Briton with more loss of life. The following day around 40 miles SW of Scillonian U-55 sank wheat-carrying SS Yolan losing all 33 hands. As part of the Admiralty's drive to counter the horrendous state of affairs, 4 additional naval aircraft arrived in Cornwall to augment the aerial anti-submarine patrols.



One significant sinking was that of Steam Ship (SS) Laconia. At the outbreak of the war the Cunard Ocean Lines SS Laconia was turned into an armed merchant cruiser and based at Simonstown, South Africa. She patrolled the South Atlantic and Indian Ocean until April 1915, after which she was involved in operations to capture the colony of German East Africa, and then returned to serve with Cunard. It was on her voyage from the USA to England that she was torpedoed by U-50 on 25 March 1917 and sunk 160 miles off Ireland. Twelve people were killed, six crew and six passengers, including Americans. The sinking stirred up opinion in the USA against Germany and influenced the USA to join the war. Interestingly, the wreck was located in 2009 and then ensued the argument between Britain and the USA as to who was entitled to claim the contents of her hold of 852 bars of silver, 132 boxes of silver coins, from Mexico and South America, worth £3m.

We'd like to wish everyone a very Happy New Year! Thank you to everyone for your support and kind donations throughout 2016. With your generosity, we are able to help our community and make an impact on people's lives. We currently have plenty of sugar, beans and soup at the moment, but we are short of **longlife fruit juice, tea and tinned tomatoes.**

It was a very busy time at the Foodbank in the run up to Christmas. We delivered our special Christmas Foodboxes to 70 families who were referred to us by a professional organisation to enable them to participate in Christmas celebrations that they may otherwise wouldn't have been able to. We also received a lovely Christmas box full of food as part of an advent campaign whereby the family donated an item every day throughout December. Such a lovely idea and much appreciated by our Foodbank.

On average we provide approximately 1,360 meals every week and since April this year we have fed 2,216 people, this brings a total of nearly 17,000

people fed from our Foodbanks since we opened our doors in 2009. Cornwall is considered to be a wealthy county however the harsh reality is that poverty is evident within our communities.

With the support of the professional services, we reached some of the most vulnerable people, during the colder season families can struggle to pay their fuel bills and are often faced with the decision to 'heat or eat'. The demand for our Foodbanks is especially high in the winter and continues to rise year on year and there is a constant demand for the valuable service we provide.
